- Fundraising for 2019 was good for three main reasons:
 - Achieving charitable status in April of 2018
 - Dorje Dolma Yak Girl book tour elevated Altitude Project's profile and increased our mailing list significantly.
 - As a result of Dorje's tour, there are three people that are discussing large potential donations: \$15,000; \$10,000; \$10,000; one person will trek to the Dolpo this fall with us.
 - Some of these donations wish the funds to be targeted to water, greenhouse and stove projects – still to be determined
 - o People tell us that they like that all funds go to the project no administration fees
- We learned of many new methods to receive donations:
 - Canada Helps; monthly donation option, ability to accept securities; cost is 3%
 - PayPal Giving Fund for registered charities donations using credit or debit card through the website have no fees - 0%.
 - o Facebook Fundraisers tied to PayPal Giving Fund
 - Charities Aid Foundation (CAF) America accept donations from US with tax receipt provided to US donors due to reciprocal agreement with Canadian Aid Foundation (CAF) Canada
 - o All three organizations provide tax receipts to donors, which reduces our administration burden
- Ann Nelson's support as website designer, editor, setting up payment methods with Canada Helps, PayPal Giving Fund, CAF America / Canada has been crucial.
- A new Treasurer was appointed during the year and duties of Treasurer and Bookkeeper are now split between two people
- We migrated our accounting to Quickbooks On-line from the desktop version.
- We had assistance from PRT's Executive Assistant to create letterhead and receipt format.
- David Swain, President, will travel to the Upper Dolpo in Sep / Oct 2019 on a 45 day trip to visit all five villages where Altitude Project supports schools, and will evaluate the solar light program, test water quality at schools, investigate the greenhouse program concept for 2020 and deliver 200 menstrual kits to health posts.

All Directors agreed to maintain their position on the Board of Altitude Project for the coming year.
